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In Service of Seniors: Pittsburgh

In Service of Seniors: Pittsburgh (ISOSP) is a program of Wesley Family Services that provides services with a mission to maximize the independence of older adults in the Pittsburgh area through volunteerbased practical supports.

ISOSP staff work with volunteers from the community, from universities, from religious congregations of all faiths, and from local businesses and professional groups to provide free neighborly services to adults age 60 and older.

How Can Someone Get Help?

What Services are Provided through ISOSP?

Services provided by ISOSP volunteers include:

- Friendly visiting or friendly phone calls once a week or every other week
- Assistance with grocery shopping
- Transportation to/from medical appointments, pharmacy, therapy, etc.
- Assistance reading and sorting mail
- Home safety assessments and grab bar installations to minimize fall and fire hazards

As part of program enrollment for most service requests, ISOSP staff visit each participant for an in-home assessment to make sure the program will be a good fit.

Because ISOSP relies on volunteers to provide services, the program cannot guarantee assistance for every request.

Who is Eligible to Receive Services?

Allegheny County residents aged 60 or older qualify for free help from our program. ISOSP is a welcoming program and is open to all, regardless of income, race, sexual orientation, or religious affiliation.

Please note the following:

Volunteers provide transportation in their personal vehicles. Participants requesting transportation must be able to transfer into and out of a vehicle independently.

Volunteers are <u>unable</u> to assist with housecleaning, money management (including bill paying), meal preparation, personal care, pet care, yard work, or help with packing or moving.
