Program Overview

As we age, many of us are no longer able to do the things we once enjoyed and we may worry about remaining safely in our homes. With Options Care Management for Older Adults, our team of professional Care Managers advocates for older adults and their caregivers, assesses their needs and their strengths, arranges inhome services, and helps participants live safely and independently.

Options Care Management is made available through the Allegheny County Area Agency on Aging (AAA). Persons who are 60 years of age or older may be eligible for Options long-term care services. These services are intended to provide high-quality, customized support to help older adults and their caregivers.

There is no financial eligibility requirement for Options Care Management services. However, individuals may be assessed a minimal copayment for services coordinated through Options Care Management. This co-payment is based on income and will not be more than the total cost of services.

What is a Care Manager?

A Care Manager is a trained professional that works with you and your family and/or caregivers. The Care Manager helps to facilitate and coordinate access to home and community-based services and resources, including medical, social and educational services. Wesley Family Services will assign participants a Care Manager who will work with you and your family to develop a care plan that addresses your needs and build on strengths, as identified by the assessment. The Care Manager coordinates the services necessary to live in the community for as long as you are able and choose to do so. Care Management may be offered as either part of a continuum of services or a stand-alone service.

What About My Current Caregivers?

Options Care Management is designed to get input and engagement from all of your natural supports, e.g., family, friends, relatives, etc. The Caregiver Support Program is a subsidiary of Options Care Management and is designed to assist families and other unpaid caregivers. The program's goal is to reduce caregiver stress and burden through benefits and resource counseling, access to support groups, caregiver skills training and education.

Services Coordinated through Options Care Management

- Adult Day Care Services: Licensed day care programs are available for individuals who need supervision and are not capable of full-time independent living.
- **Chore Service:** Help may be provided with home maintenance tasks.

- Home-delivered Meals: Nutritious meals are delivered weekdays to homebound individuals who are unable to safely prepare meals, have difficulty leaving their homes to purchase groceries, or have no other means to acquire meals on a regular basis.
- Personal Care: In-home assistance may be provided for individuals with limited ability to perform daily living activities, such as bathing, dressing, grooming and walking.
- Senior Companion Program: Provides regular visits and assistance to older adults, 60 years of age and older, in their home. Volunteer companions, 55 years of age and older, may assist with simple daily activities, serve as an escort for shopping, medical, or social outings, or provide caregiver relief.
