

## Foster Grandparent Program: Frequently Asked Questions

### Do I take children into my home?

No. You will volunteer in a supervised classroom setting. Foster Grandparents do not take children into their homes, and the Program is not associated with the Foster Care system.

### How old are the children I would help?

You can help children from the ages of 0 to 21 years old. However, the average age of children served are between 3 and 5 years of age.

### When and where would I volunteer?

Schedules vary per individual. We try to accommodate the needs of all parties involved. We match volunteers to a location close to home.

## Eligibility Requirements

- Must be 55 years of age or older
- Must meet income guidelines (200% federal poverty level)
- Must pass all required background checks
- Must complete the orientation process
- Must be able to serve on a consistent schedule of at least 15 hours per week
- Must be comfortable around and helping children
